The Mary Ann Partin Scholarship: SOPHIE ELLEMAN - MILFORD HIGH SCHOOL

She received the Excellence in Chinese Award, ECC All-Conference Academic Awards, and a Purdue University Award for Best 3-D Print at their Top Engineering Prospects Seminar. Ellen completed 160 Community Service Hours and maintains a 4.665 GPA. She will major in biomedical engineering and Chinese at the University of Wisconsin.

The Imbus Family Scholarship: MEGAN PIERCE- MILFORD HIGH SCHOOL

The Imbus Family Scholarship is a \$5,000 scholarship made possible by an endowment from Mr. John Imbus, Class of 1959. Criteria: Majoring in engineering, preferably Civil Engineering, academic achievement, community service, and financial need.

She received a Certificate of Academic Excellence in Math, was named ECC All-Conference Award for cross country, and a National Honor Society certificate and pin. This \$5,000 scholarship is made possible by a posthumous endowment from Jo Ann Fley, a 1948 Milford graduate and daughter of former Milford superintendent James H. Fley. Criteria: Academic achievement, community service, financial need.

Her activities included National Honor Society, Children's Hospital, Key Club, knitting club, MHS Writing Center, OMEA Violin Ensemble, and Youth Sinfonia Asst. Concertmaster. Sophie has completed 12 AP courses, has a 5.035 GPA, and is an AP Scholar with Distinction. She will study chemistry and neuroscience at Miami University.
